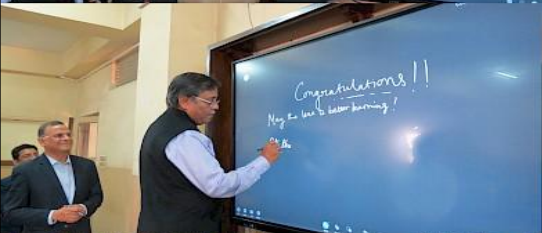

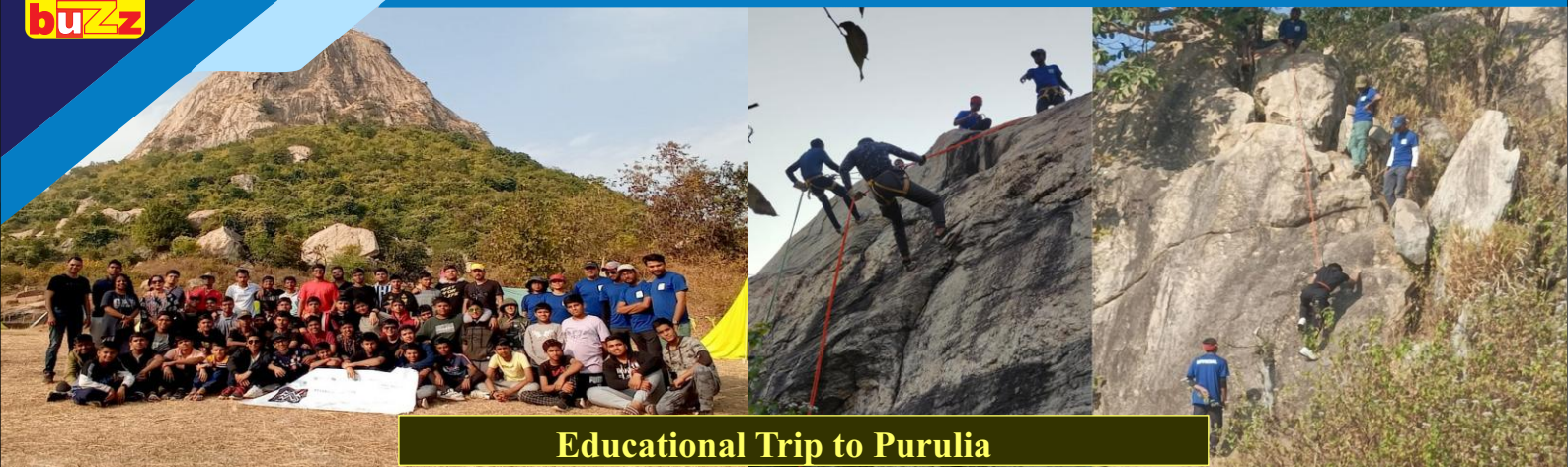
This exhibition was indeed one of the gateways for our students to imbibe the 21<sup>st</sup> century life skills of global citizenship, empathy and collaboration.

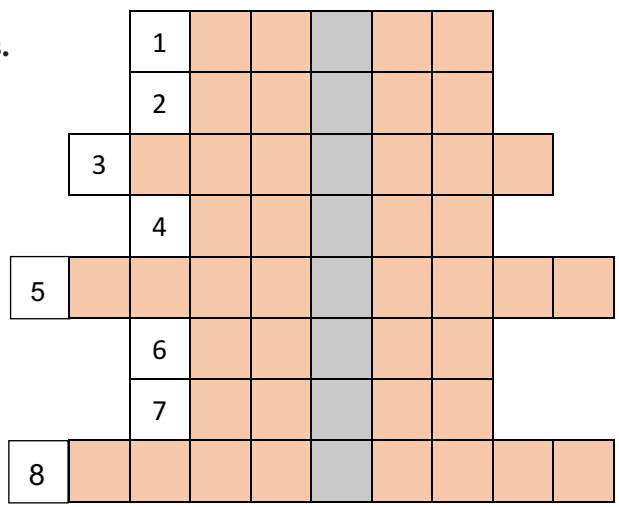
