
PRESENTATION

During the session, young budding research analysts from Class 11 shared their research findings on a wide range of topics, including economic development, unemployment, and startups in India.


Through this initiative, the school aimed to foster peerto-peer learning and provide opportunities for the

This activity truly made their grandparents feel special and instilled a sense of respect and responsibility among the children towards their elders.


Wonder Kid
